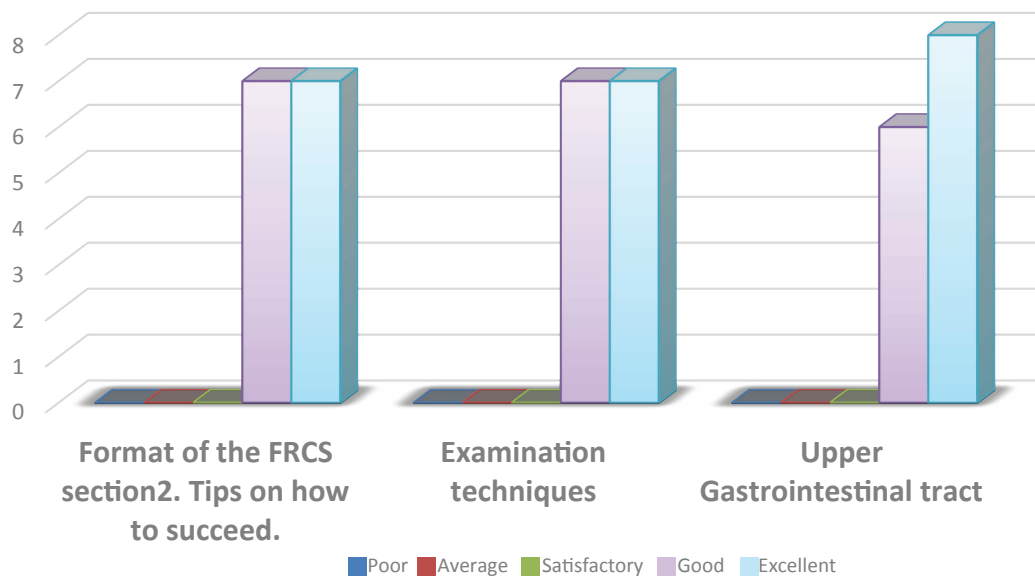
- Clinical examination practice with real patients - excellent session. Good overview of theory and practical. The overall organisation of the event was excellent.

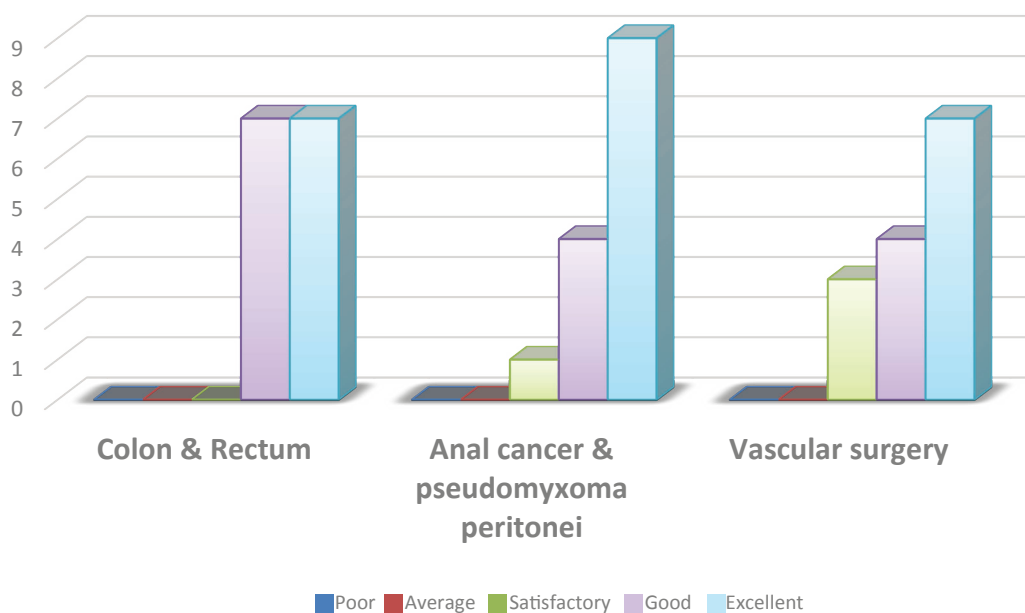

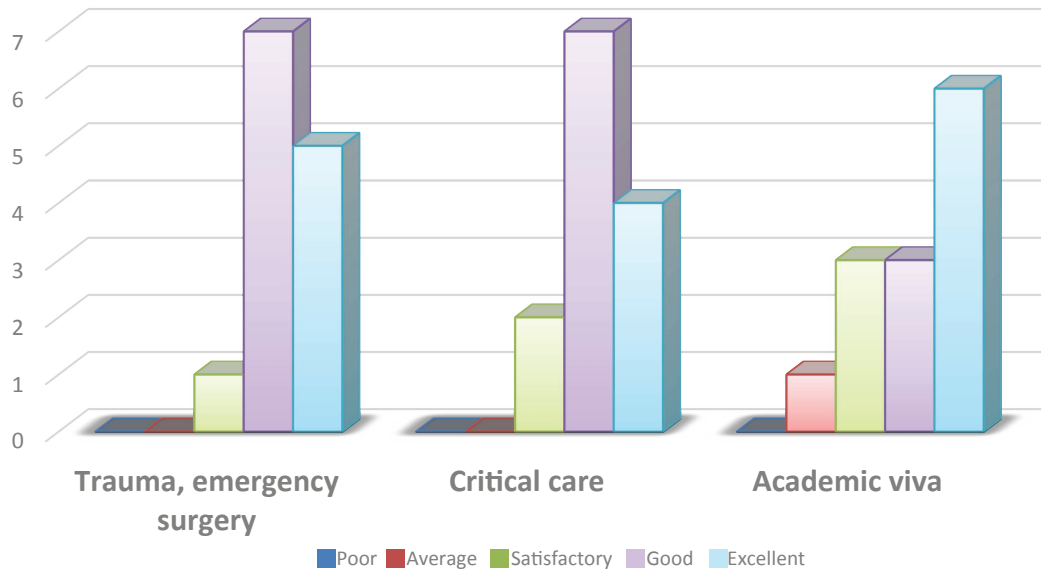

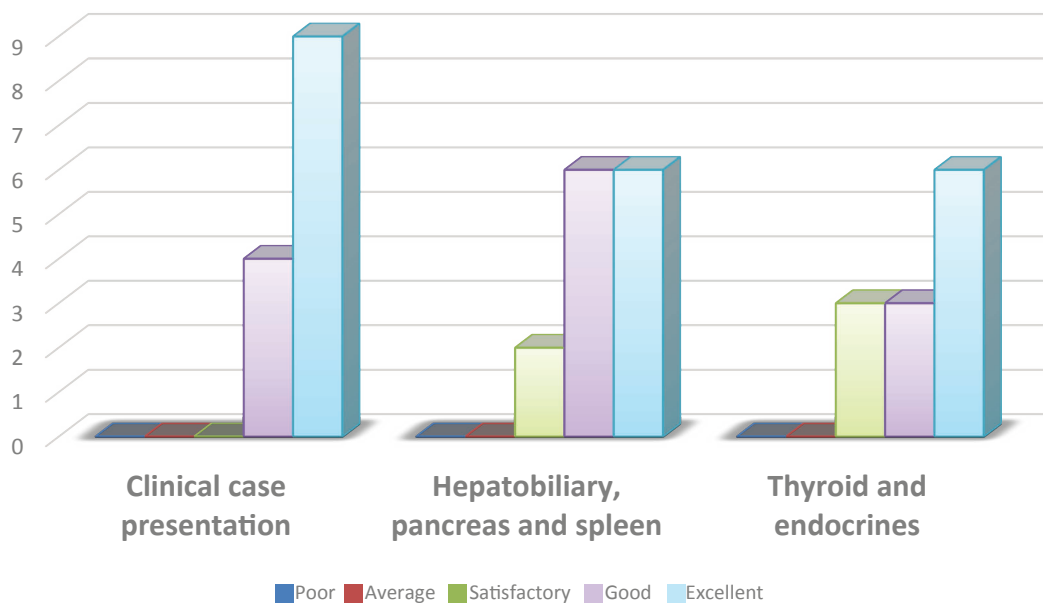

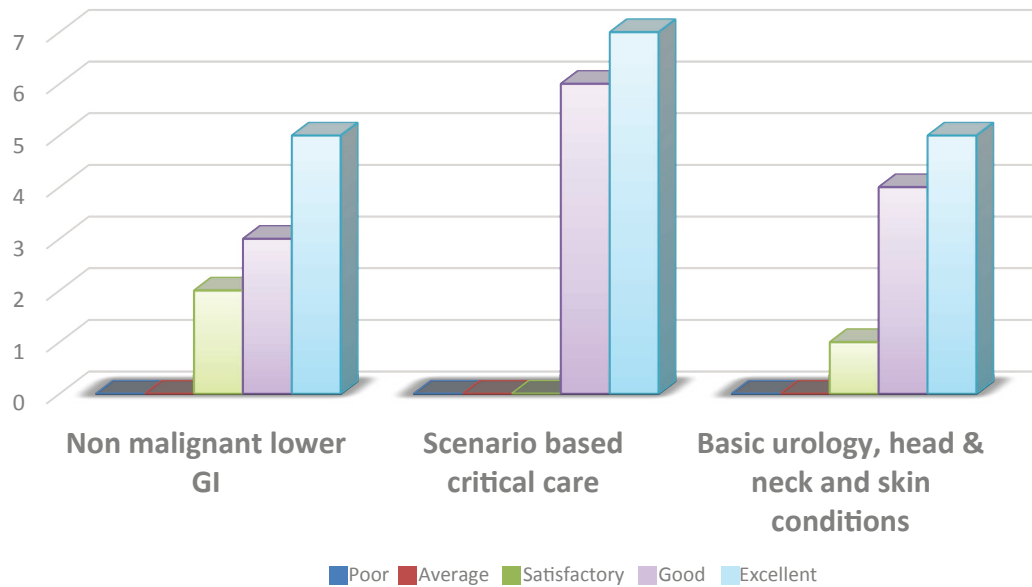

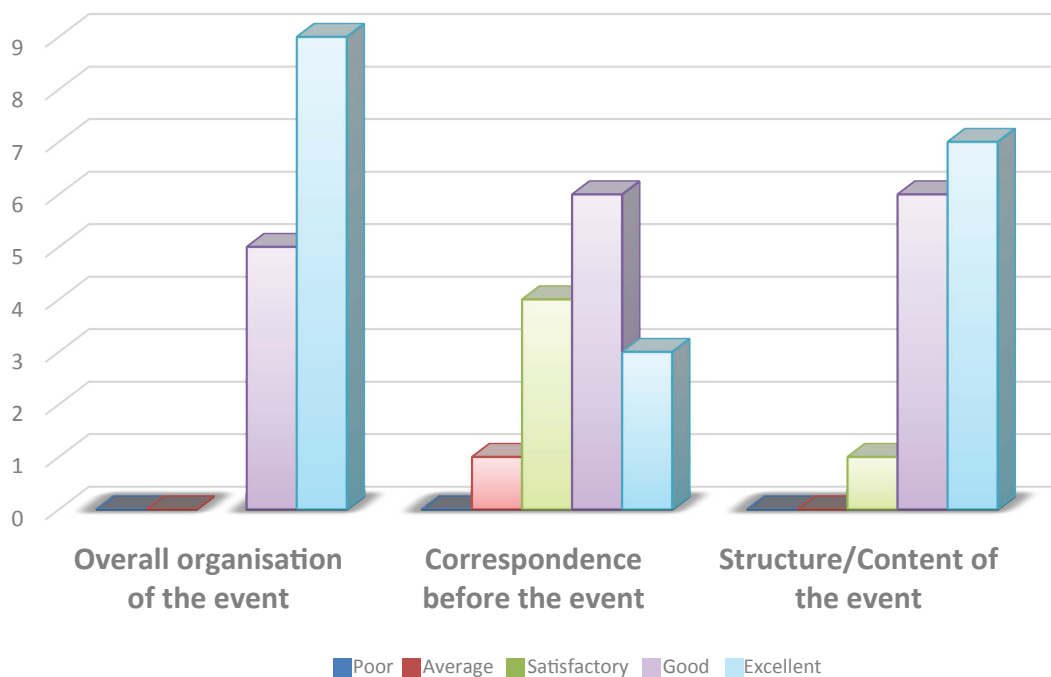

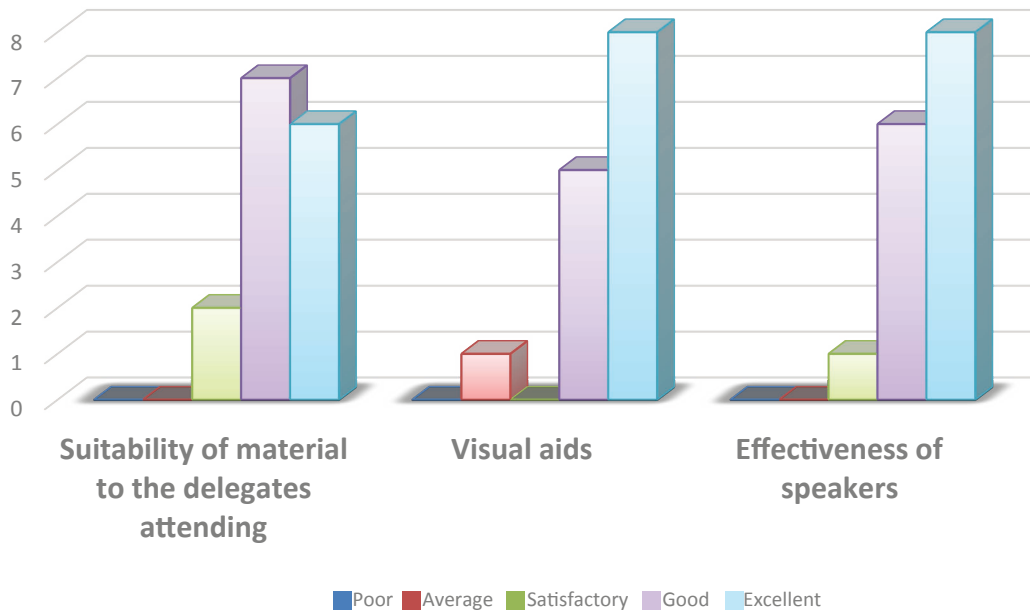


Overview of Course (1)

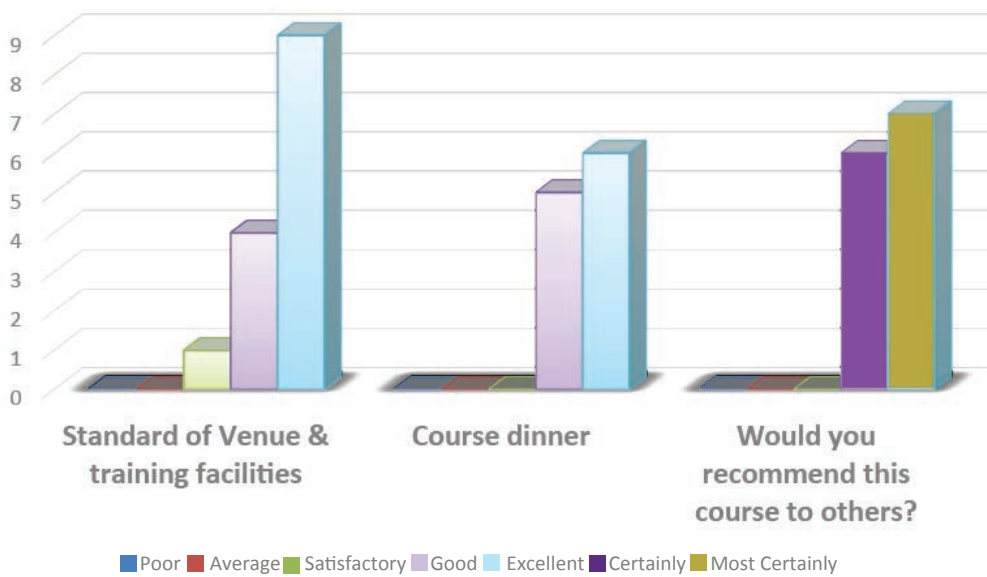
