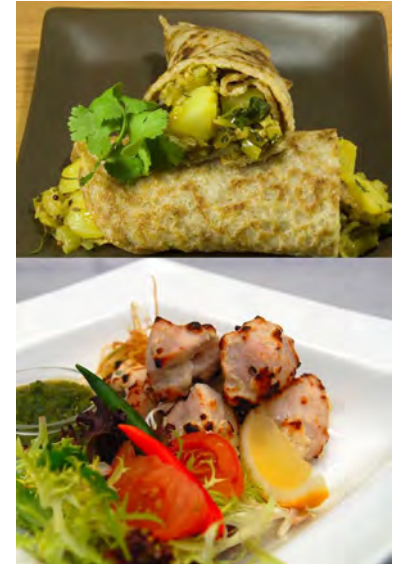

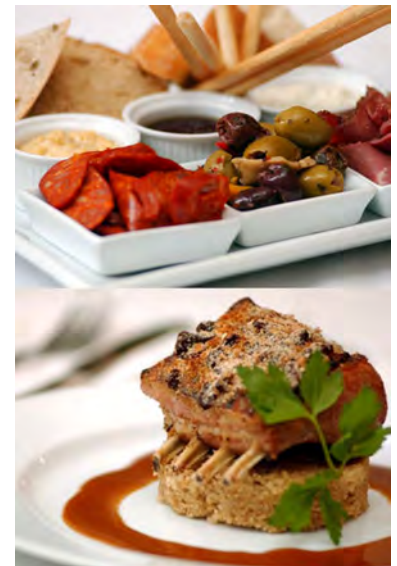

It's claimed there are over 70 Asian takeaways and restaurants in Rusholme in less than a mile stretch. There's a massive choice of Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi and Perisan restaurants with the late night openings making them particularly popular with students and party goers.

Teppanyaki "Restaurant"

Phetpailin opened in April 2006 bringing a traditional and authentic Thai dining experience to Manchester's Chinatown. While the a la carte menu here is standard 'Anglo-Thai' cuisine, the specials board offers traditional Thai dishes prepared as they would be in Thailand. And the result is that a very healthy 60% of the clientele here are Thais, which is always a good sign for an ethnic restaurant. The décor is both traditional and minimalist with none of the clutter that can sometimes take over a restaurant. And it's very much a relaxed vibe, with light background music making for a peaceful and calming dining experience. Phetpailin (literally, 'sapphire') is currently unlicensed and they operate a BYO policy on alcoholic drinks. There is also a takeaway service (10% off when you spend more than £10) and an outside catering service.
