This conference was an excellent opportunity for medical students and junior doctors to gain an insight into the ever-changing world of cardiovascular research. With keynote speeches from pioneering researchers and academic clinicians, this event was a chance to be inspired and explore the latest innovations in cardiovascular medicine. The day comprised of workshops and cardiac simulators, which provided the ideal platform for medical students to gain early exposure to procedures beyond the scope of typical undergraduate curriculum. Delegates were also given the opportunity to present their own research to a panel of distinguished researchers and clinicians, with prizes to be awarded for winning entries. Abstracts of original research, audits and systemic reviews were welcomed for poster and oral presentation.

To provide opportunities to practice relevant clinical skills that are beyond the typical undergraduate curriculum.






