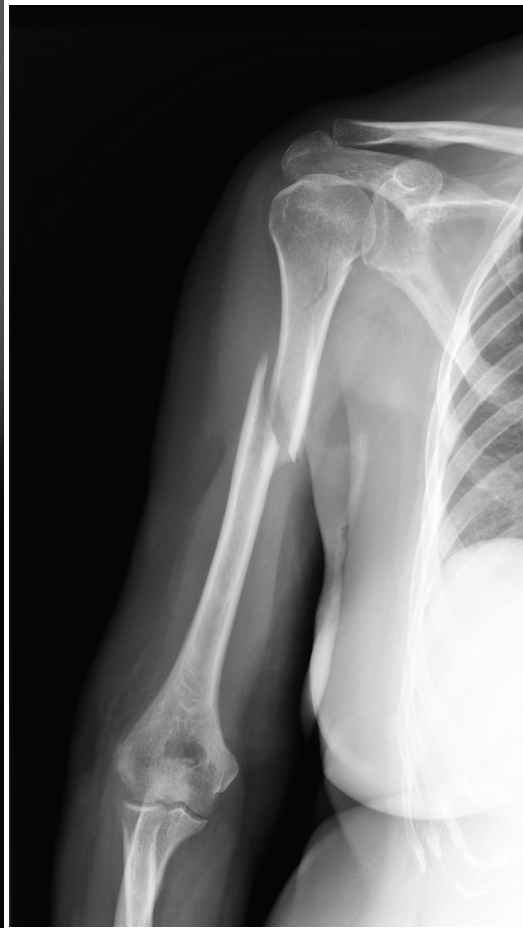
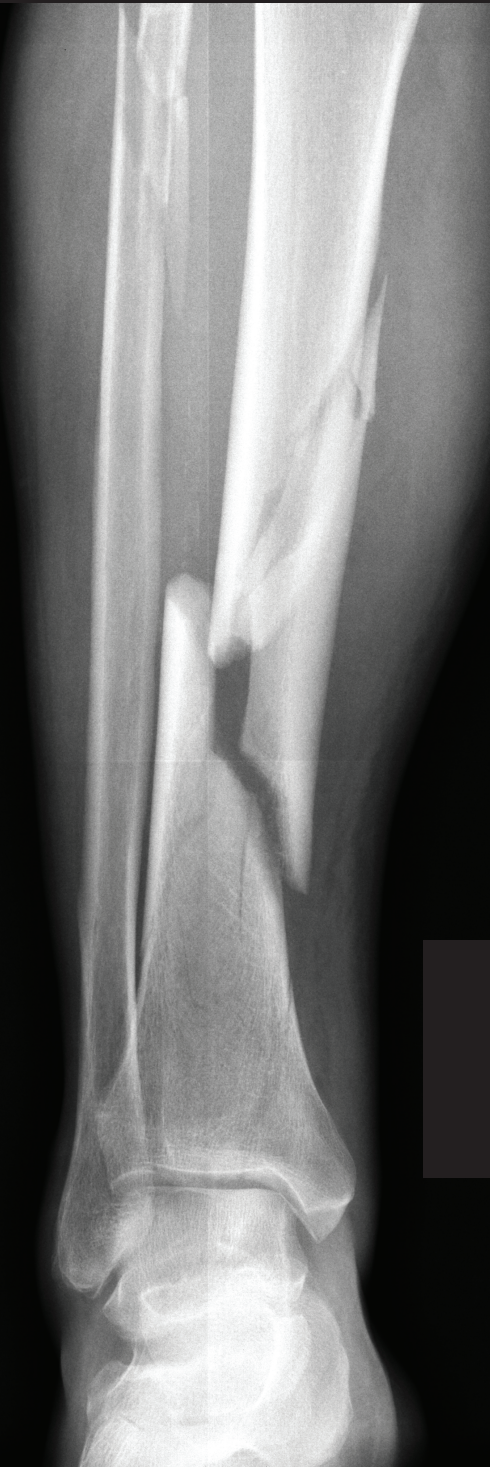

Description:

This all day event was designed to provide an overview of the fundamentals and essential principles in managing trauma for medical students and foundation doctors interested in a career in orthopaedic/trauma surgery, emergency medicine or anaesthetics. The event enabled the attendees to enhance their knowledge of trauma care and provided a forum for like-minded individuals to discuss the current developments and evolving aspects in this area. The day comprised of short and relevant interactive talks by eminent speakers in the morning and scenario-based workshops in the afternoon.

Structure:

- o Four relevant talks were given by experts in the field that also provided the information for the four related practical workshops in the afternoon.
- o Each workshop included one of the essential skills related to trauma management:
 - o Self-Care: how to manage the stress that can accompany looking after traumatic injuries?
 - o Managing Difficult Patients: how to deal with a stressed or angry patient/parent?
 - o Hand Overs: how to give an effective handover?
 - o Ethics: considering some of the ethical issues that can arise in patients with trauma

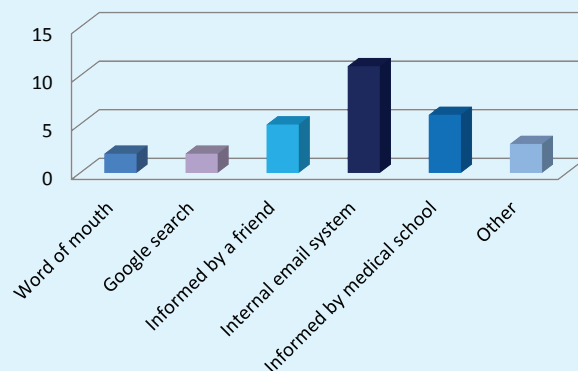

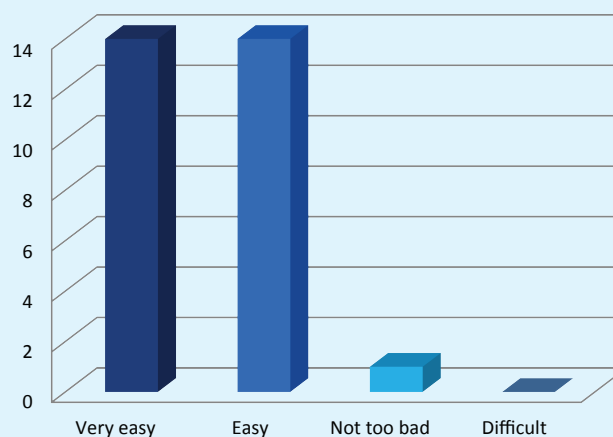

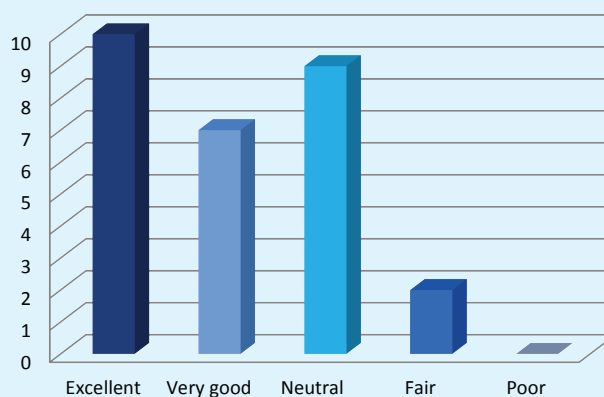

How easy was it to register and pay for the event?

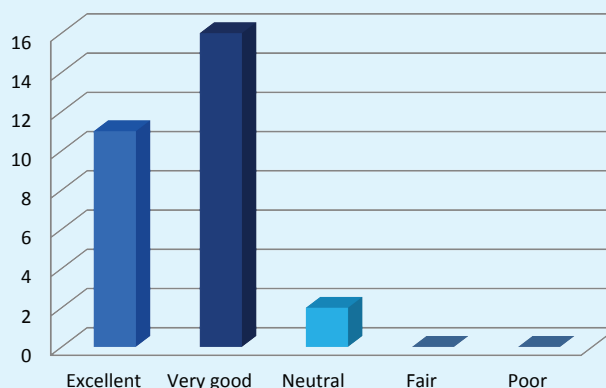


How was the information you received regarding the venue and directions?

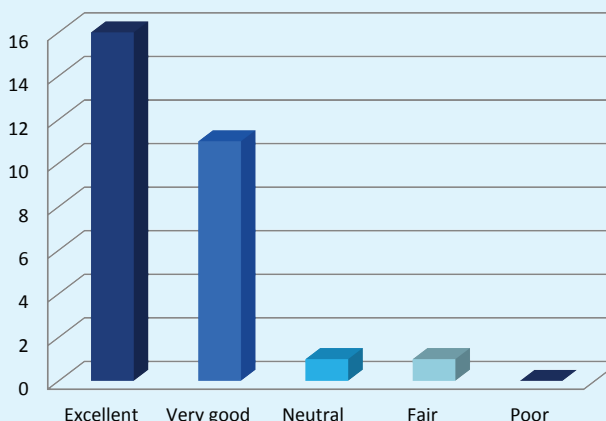


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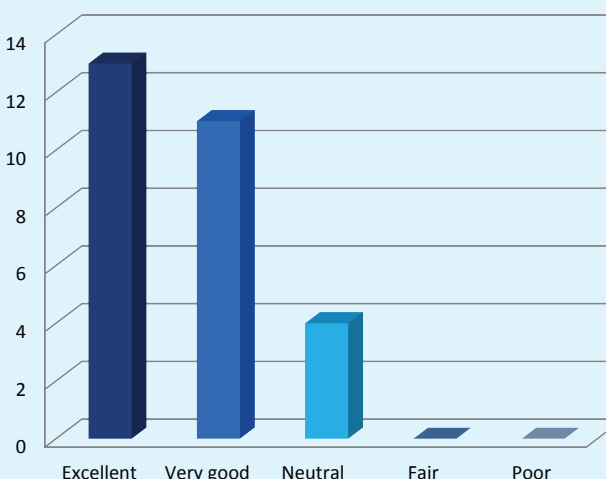
How was the clarity and usefulness of PowerPoint presentations?



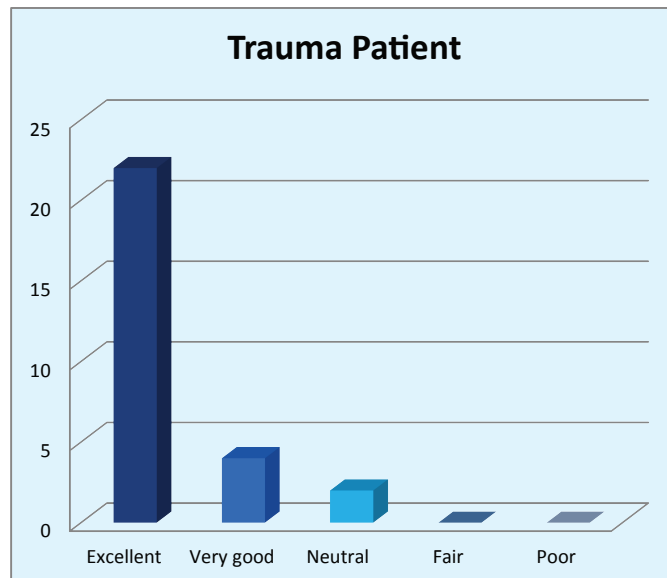
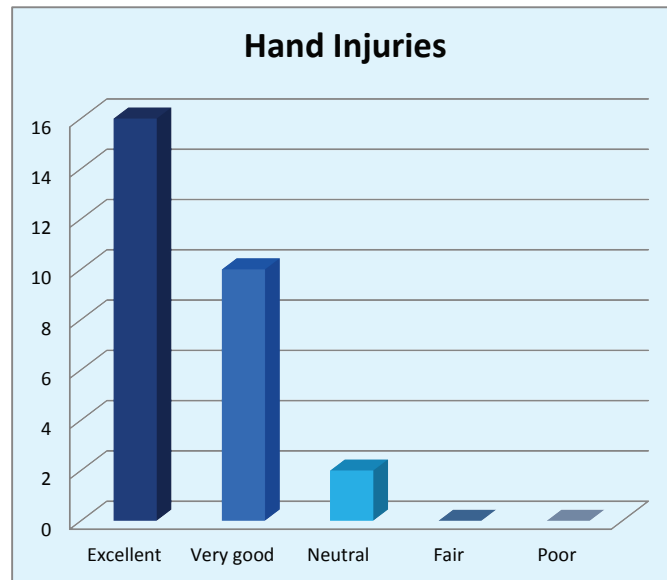
How would you rate the general standard of the speakers?

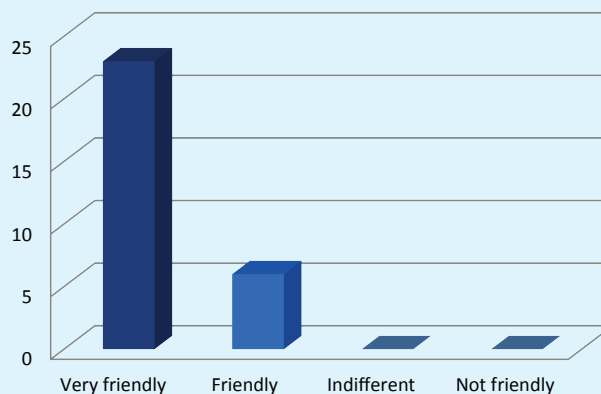


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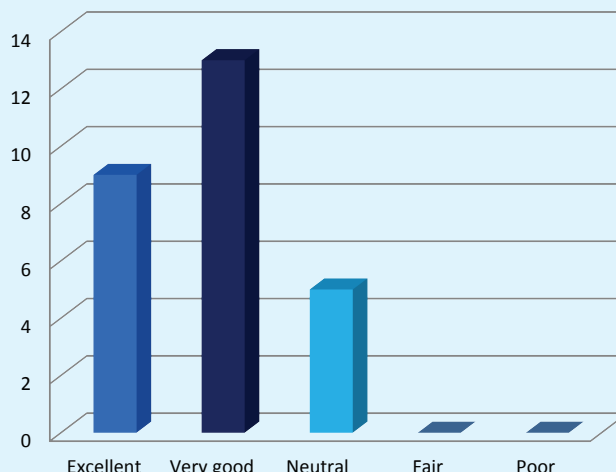


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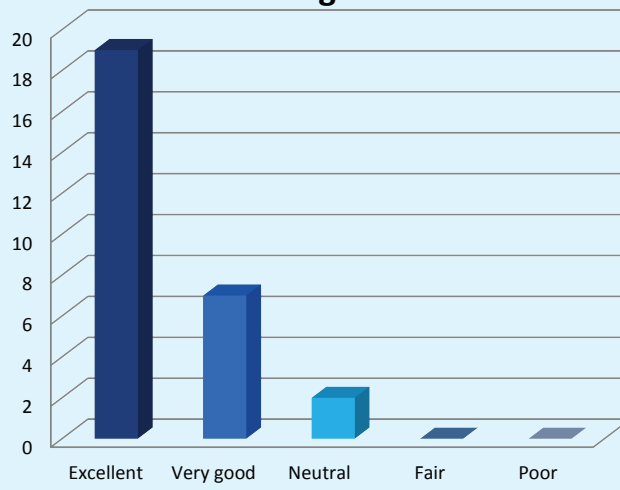

Workshop - Burns Management

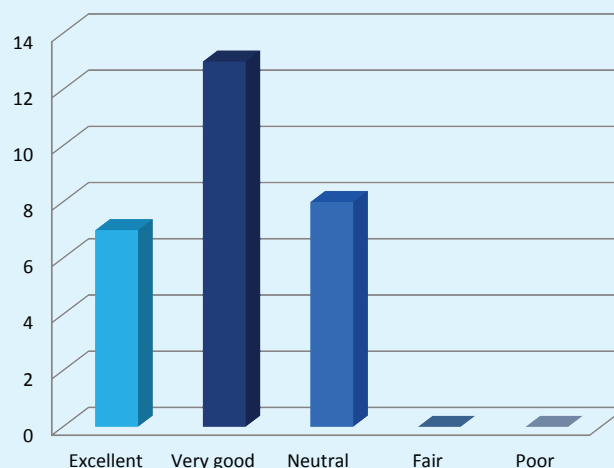


Workshop - Major Poly Trauma Management

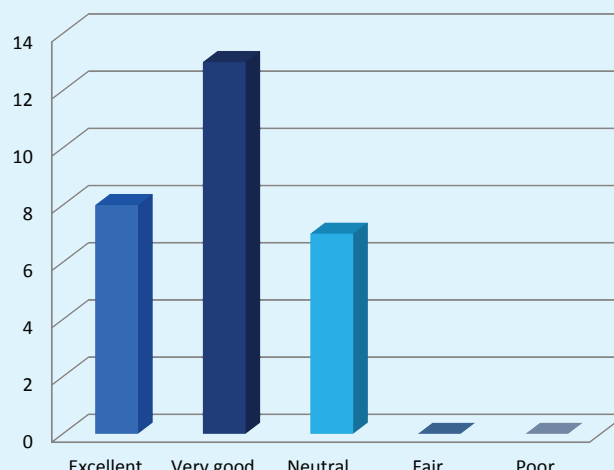


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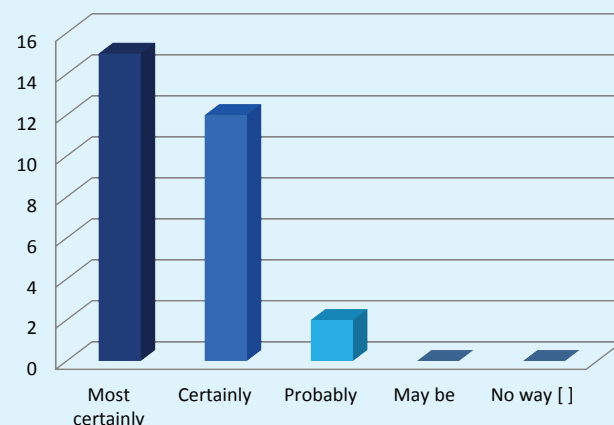
Workshop - Managing Difficult Patients



Workshop - Long Bone Fractures

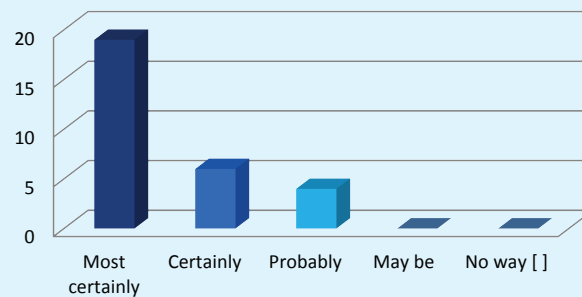

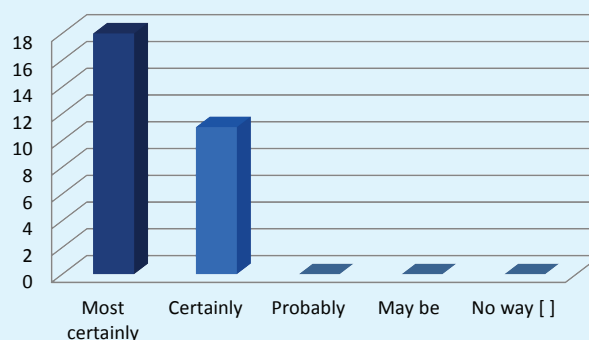
