- There is a direct bus service (number 147) that runs every 10 minutes from Manchester Piccadilly Railway Station. This bus service alights outside "Library".
- Buses from Manchester City Centre are very regular. Please use bus numbers 15, 42, 43, 142 or 143 and alight at Manchester Royal Infirmary on Oxford Road.

Parking:

- Event attendees must park in the multi-storey car park on Hathersage Road (indicated to the top right-hand side of the map attached).
- Please walk from the car park along Hathersage Road towards Oxford Road. Before reaching Oxford Road, turn right into the hospital grounds. You will be able to see the new Children's Hospital to your right.
- Walk down the new roadway to the Library (the entrance is indicated by a green arrow on the map attached). PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS BUILDING HAS BEEN RENAMED AND IS NOW CALLED "LIBRARY AND POSTGRADUATE CENTRE". The receptionist in the Library and Postgraduate Centre will direct you to the Postgraduate Building.
- At the end of the event, kindly take your car parking ticket to the Security Lodge in the car park and present your university/hospital ID badge. The security staff will reduce your car parking charge to £5 for the full day.
- Please note that, if you park in Grafton Street Car Park, you will be liable for the full £15 charge for parking. There are no reduced rates for this Car Park.

The Structure of the Sessions:

The workshops will use artwork in identifying important surface anatomy landmarks, the structures that lie beneath it, and their clinical/operative significance. This involves drawing surface anatomy structures on another delegate with whom you will be paired. Within your pairs, you will have the opportunity to practice drawing on each other. Body surfaces that you will be practicing on include the face, neck, chest, abdomen, arms and legs (chest will be used only in male participants). We will provide washable marker pens to be used on the skin. Appropriate wipes will also be provided to remove the ink. If you are allergic to any sort of marker pen or ink on your skin, kindly inform us beforehand.

Dress Code:

Please note that the course will involve having surface anatomy structures drawn on your skin. You should therefore bring suitable clothing (e.g. shorts and a vest top). There is a place to change inside the venue.

What to Prepare:

If you have the time, we advise you to read about clinical anatomy. If you are able to brush up on your anatomy prior to the event, you will find the day even more beneficial.

Course Material:

There is no formal course material. Kindly bring with you a notebook (A5 sized jotter pad) and a pen to note pertinent points. Any relevant educational material will be mailed to you following the event.

Refreshments:

Tea, coffee and biscuits will be provided during the morning and afternoon breaks. There are plenty of places near the venue for you to buy lunch. There is a Marks and Spencer and a Starbucks in the hospital grounds, as well as a Greggs, Costa and other places located on Oxford Road. Alternatively, you may consider bringing your own lunch.
