It will cost approximately £10-£12 for a taxi from Manchester Piccadilly train station to the Christie Hospital. It will take approximately 20 minutes. If you are arriving by taxi, please ask the taxi to drop you off at the Main Entrance (Oak Road Entrance) of the hospital.

Parking

'Pay and display' car parks are available on the hospital premises.

Suggested Car Parks:

Car Park C (multi-storey) on Palatine Road and Car Park D on Wilmslow Road are for visitors. Accessible parking (Blue Badge) is available.

Car Parking Procedures and Charges:

- As you enter the car park, take a ticket at the barrier and park.
- Before you return to your vehicle when you are leaving, insert the ticket and money into the Pay Station.
- There is a Pay Station for use only in Car Park C (multi-storey). It is located on the ground floor by the pedestrian exit. Coins are accepted but notes and cards are not.
- There is a Pay Station inside Car Park D. There is another Pay Station for Car Park D onlyin side Oak Road main reception. Coins and notes are accepted but cards are not.
- The Pay Stations give change and receipts.
- Charges are displayed at the Pay Stations.
- Charges: first 30 minutes are free; then it is £1.50 per day.
- There is a cash machine in the Oak Road main reception.
- Upon returning to your vehicle, please insert your validated ticket at the barrier to exit the car park.
- Please note: parking on local roads is restricted.

III. COURSE FORMAT AND CONTENT

This course is a structured programme of learning basic surgical skills and techniques. Delivered using a series of tutor demonstrations and hands-on sessions on animal tissue, the course will introduce you to the safe basic surgical techniques that are common to all surgical practices.

On completion of this course, you will be able to: (i) Demonstrate an appropriate procedure for 'gowning' and 'gloving' in accordance with recommended standards of practice; (ii) Tie a variety of reliable knots, including, surgical reef knots and the Aberdeen knot and tying at depth. (iii) Describe correct handling and use of surgical instruments. (iv) Suture a variety of tissues,

including skin, bowel, vascular tissue and tendons effectively. (v) Perform abscess drainage and contaminated wound debridement in accordance with the basic principles of wound management. (vi) Demonstrate safe fine tissue handling utilising small bowel, vascular and tendon models for basic anastomoses technique. (vii) Demonstrate an understanding of basic diathermic technique. (viii) Demonstrate effective management of ergonomic issues commonly encountered in endoscopic surgery.

IV. PRE-COURSE MATERIAL

You will have already gained access to the pre-course online material and videos. This is provided to give you a background to the course, as well as additional theoretical knowledge. While the material and videos should be viewed prior to the course, it is primarily meant for you to practice exercises after the course. It is important that you do not practice exhaustively from the online material alone as specific exercises will be demonstrated during the course. These may differ slightly in method from that shown online.

If you are predominantly right-handed, you should tie with your left hand, and vice-versa. If you are naturally ambidextrous, then by all means use both hands.
