Friends of MSF: Sustainability and Climate Change Conference

Climate change is one of the biggest threats to humanity; a four-degree increase in temperature will result in the displacement of 760 million people due to the rising of sea levels. Other catastrophic effects, if not addressed in time, could include water shortage, crop failure, extreme weather, biodiversity loss, and desertification.

“Given the enormity of human impacts and political obstacles, adaptation and enhancement of resilience are essential but fundamentally insufficient, as anticipated needs will far exceed the response capabilities of relief actors.” - The Lancet Countdown with MSF.

From a field worker's experience to policymakers' standpoint, Friends of MSF's Sustainability and Climate Change Conference aimed to address how climate change will affect humanitarian aid. With a focus on advocacy and climate migration, this conference aimed to discuss how students can become more involved.





How was the content of the conference?





How would you rate the general academic standard of the speakers?













Can You Diagnose Patients in French? - UCL FoMSF







Can You Diagnose Patients in French? - UCL FoMSF





How were the facilities and venue?








