Keele National Orthoplastics Workshop 2020

Following the success of last year's event, Keele Surgical Society was pleased to announce the Keele National Orthoplastics Workshop 2020. This event offered delegates the opportunity to gain hands-on consultant-led teaching in the fields of Orthopaedic and Plastic Surgery.

These specialities are often overlooked and undertaught in the medical school curriculum despite them being large fields of medicine that impact patients from all age ranges. Therefore, Keele Surgical Society aimed to provide a useful learning resource to help impassion students about Orthopaedic and Plastic Surgery.

The event covered four workshops teaching basic skills in the field of Orthoplastics. The two Orthopaedic workshops focused on the techniques of internal fixation (plate and screws) and external fixation (uniplanar frame) on synthetic bone. The two Plastic workshops covered tendon repair (Kessler technique) and advancement flap design on animal tissue. The event also featured two lectures – one focusing on major trauma management while the other explored Orthoplastics in low-andmiddle-income countries.




