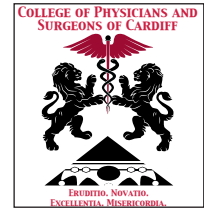


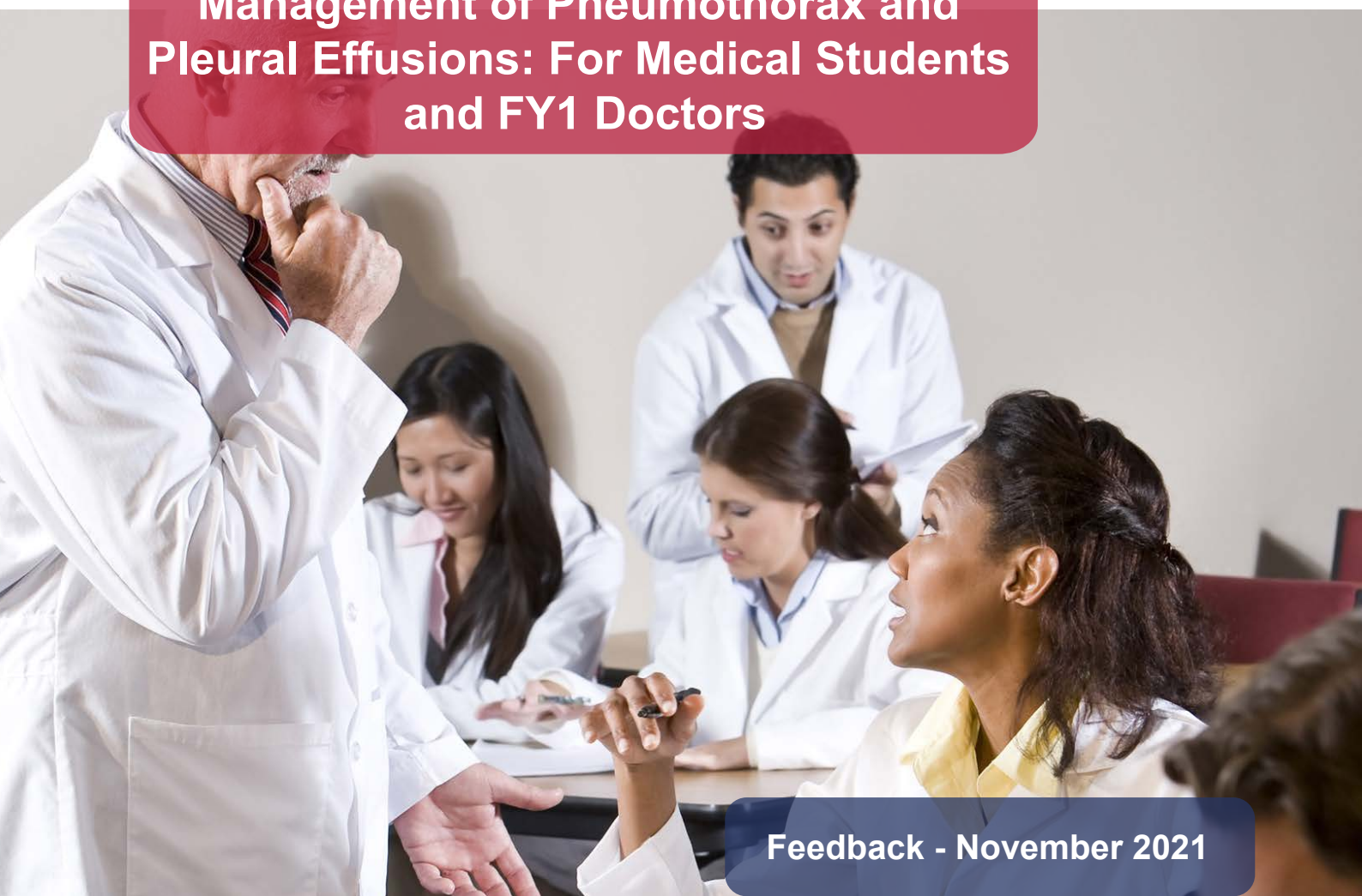

Management of Pneumothorax and Pleural Effusions: For Medical Students and FY1 Doctors

This two-part series aimed to discuss a number of common respiratory emergencies and their management. It examined their presentation and pathophysiology, as well as providing a discussion on how to treat them in an emergency clinical setting.

The first talk discussed pneumothorax and pleural effusions, as well as their drainage. An understanding of how these conditions may present and how they should be managed initially is important for any junior doctor, along with an insight into when to escalate the matter to a senior. This talk, therefore, aimed to build the confidence of Senior Medical Students and Foundation Year 1 Doctors in this topic and provided a discussion on how to treat them in an emergency clinical setting.

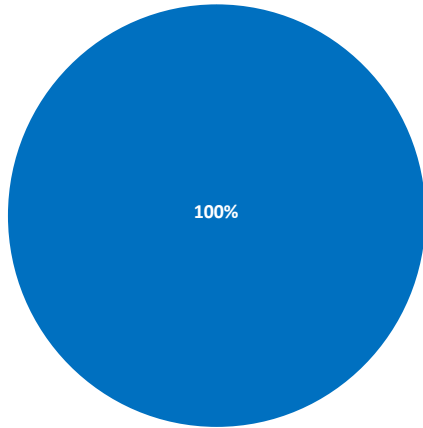

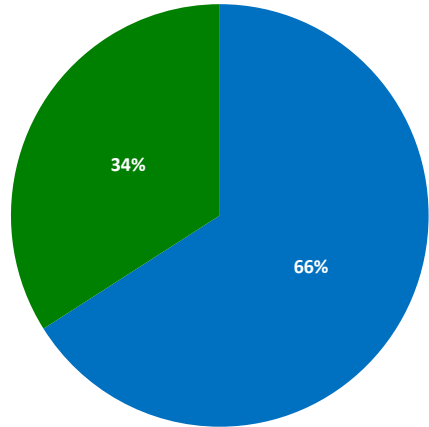

How would you rate the appropriateness of the topic to your career and/or studies?



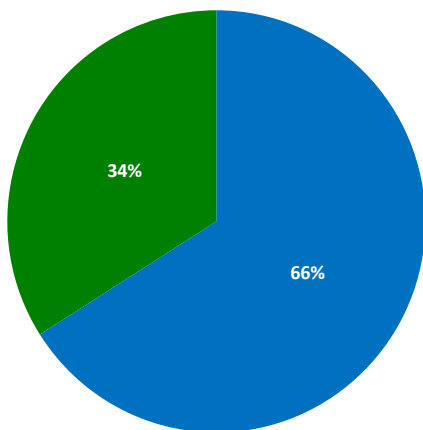

How would you rate the expertise of the speaker?



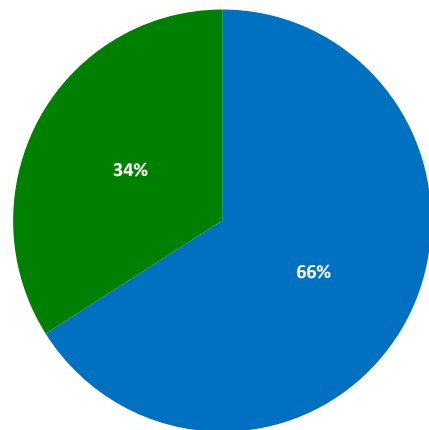

How would you rate the clarity of the information delivered?



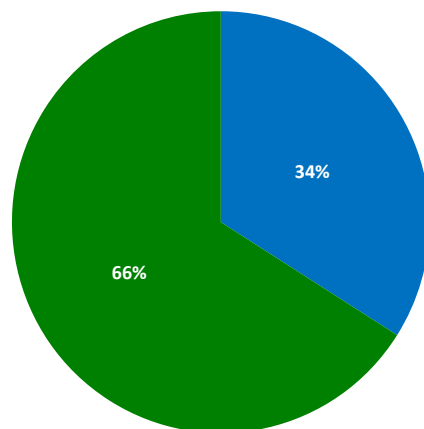
