

In the MRCS OSCE, the 'Clinical and Procedural Skills' component, that makes up about 15-20% of the total marks, tests the candidate's capacity to apply sound basic science/clinical knowledge in a practical context. The candidate's ability to perform practical tasks related to surgery that requires manual dexterity, hand-eye coordination and visual/spatial awareness will be assessed.

This intensive hands-on practical skills course taught the candidates all the important procedures that are likely to be tested in the exam and allowed them to practice in realistic exam conditions. They were provided with structured feedback and performance scores to help further development.

A total of 20 candidates attended the course. Their feedback is summarised in the subsequent pages.
