III. COURSE FORMAT AND CONTENT

This day is a structured programme of learning basic surgical skills and techniques. Delivered using a series of tutor demonstrations and hands-on sessions on animal tissue, the course will introduce to you the safe basic surgical techniques that are common to all surgical practices

On completion of the course, you should be able to:

- Demonstrate safe practice when gowning and gloving.
- Handle commonly used surgical instruments in a safe and effective manner.
- Create secure 'Reef' and 'Surgeons' knots.
- Pick up and safely drive a needle through tissue with accurate bite placement.
- Appreciate the safe use of local anaesthesia.
- Perform an interrupted suture to close a wound.
- Demonstrate the steps for excising a skin lesion under local anaesthesia.
- Excise a sebaceous cyst.
- Drain a superficial abscess.
- Perform the essential steps to debride a traumatic wound effectively.
- Perform basic techniques used for laparoscopy.
- Understand the principles of using diathermy safely.
