Live Advanced Laparoscopic Colorectal Course

This advanced laparoscopic colorectal course provided the attendee with a sound understanding of some of the recent operative developments in the field. It also provided an overview of the essential fundamentals and underpinning principles of laparoscopic colorectal surgery.

The course convened by renowned Laparoscopic Colorectal Surgeon Prof. P. N. Haray and supported by an experienced faculty, also gave an opportunity for experienced colorectal surgeons to enhance their understanding and attain invaluable tips to perform laparoscopic colorectal surgery in an effective manner.

With ample opportunities to interact with faculty during the live operative sessions as well as during the lectures. A course dinner was also organised on the evening of the first day.

The days encompassed a series of live operating demonstrations, interspersed with interactive discussions, of important colorectal operations such as:

- o Total Colectomy for conditions such as Ulcerative Colitis and Functional Bowel Disease.
- o Segmental Resections, Left-side Colonic
- o Resections including Splenic Flexure Mobilisation, and High Anterior Resection.
- Total Mesorectal Excision with Defunctioning Stomas.
- o Pouch surgeries / Panproctocolectomy.

- o Patient selection.
- o Relevant anatomy.
- o Equipment.
- o Theatre set-up.
- o Pre- and post-operative management and outcomes.
- o Enhanced recovery programs.
- o Emergency surgery.





Port positing for anterior resection








Anatomy and Theatre Set up for anterior resection




Stepwise approach to anterior resection







Stepwise approach to right hemicolectomy






Challenges of Laparoscopic TME




Transanal division of anorectal junction followed by laparoscopic low anterior resection and coloanal pouch anastomsis




Port positioning for right hemicolectomy













Stepwise approach to low anterior resection




Safety aspects in Laparoscopic colorectal surgery 45%

















