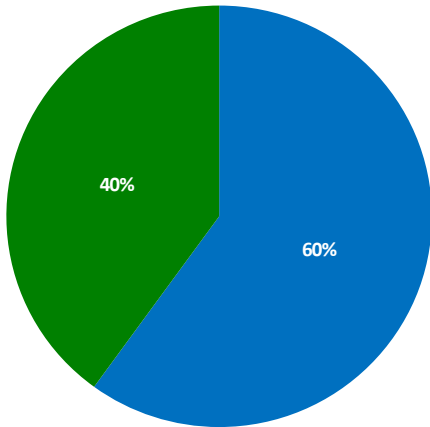

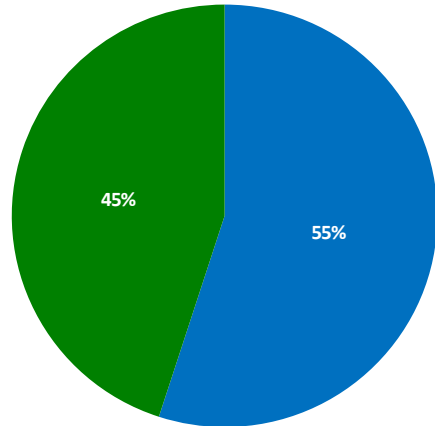

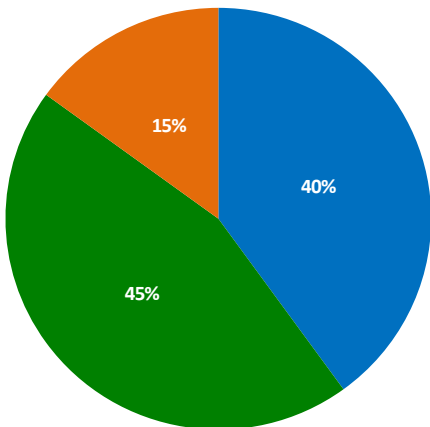

How would you rate the general academic standard of the tutors?



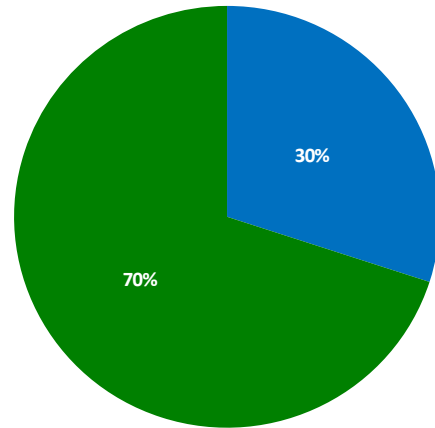

How do you rate the relevance of the course to your studies?



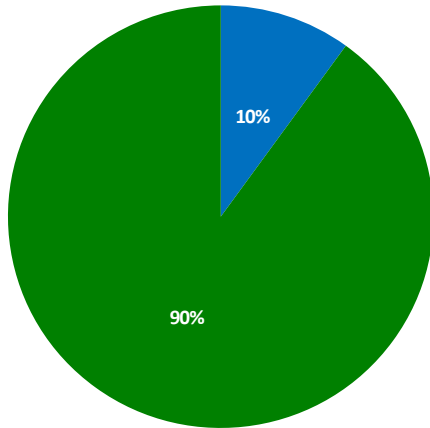

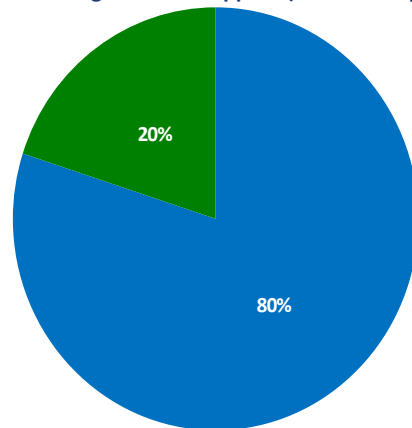

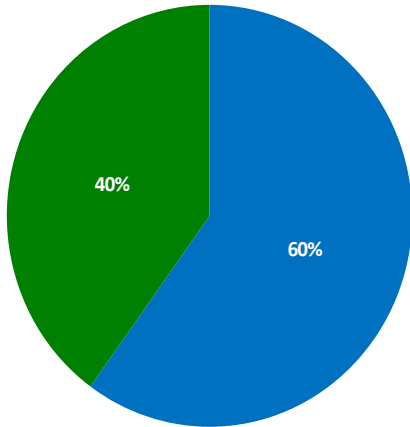

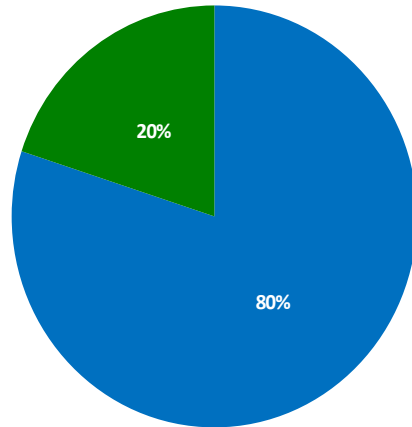

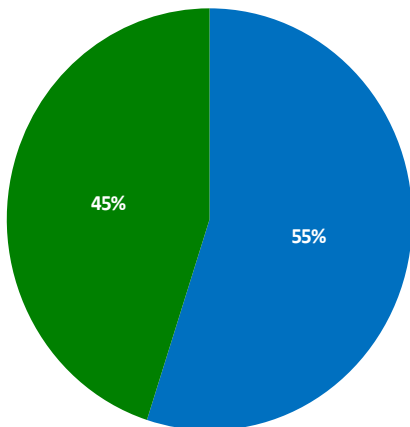

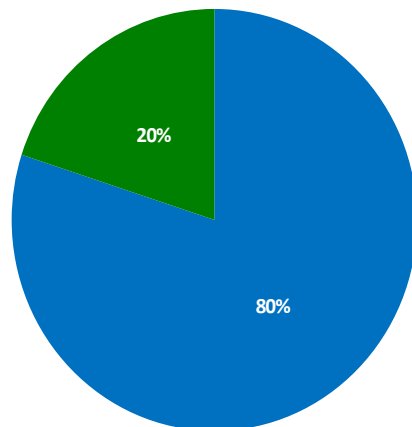

Root cause analyses of deaths associated with hospital-acquired venous thromboses over twelve months



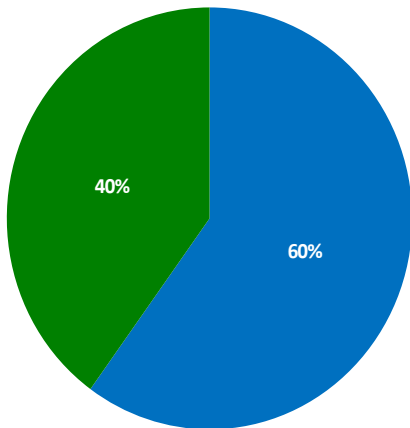

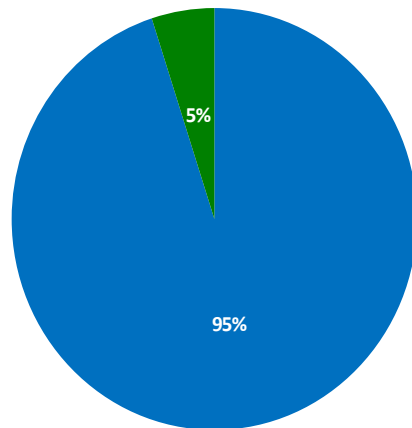

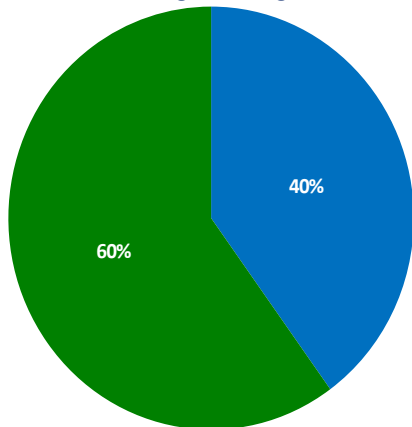
Interactive workshops - Medical emergency simulation

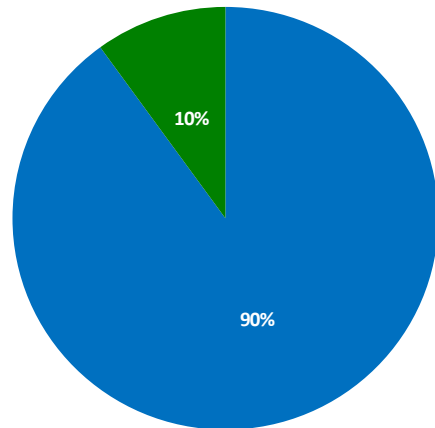

Interactive workshops - Poster Viewing and Delegate Voting



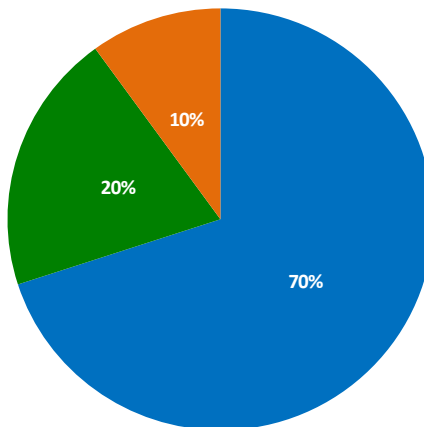
